I am also grateful to be part of a community where many family members, friends and neighbors reached out to John's family while they were being kept at a distance from their husband, father, grandfather - as he battled for his life... And albeit from a distance, I am grateful that John has family members who could make decisions about his care when he could not...

I wonder though: How many difficult decisions did John's family make along the way? Did they know what John wanted? Did they all agree on decisions made?

I also wonder: Did John ever think about how he would want to be cared for in a situation like this? Did he think about what would be most important to him if these were his last days? And, if he did, did he share his thoughts?

WOW... How many families around the world have the added anxiety of care decisions along with the physical suffering and fear instilled by this virus?

I am grateful that I learned about "Five Wishes" - a tool that helps us prepare for unforeseen situations like those precipitated by COVID-19 - a living will in simple language that encourages having the "conversation of your life" with family and doctor... I am also grateful to be part of the North Jersey Villages team that has facilitated free professional presentations on "Five Wishes" - giving Bergen County older adults and their families an opportunity to be prepared for the unforeseen!
